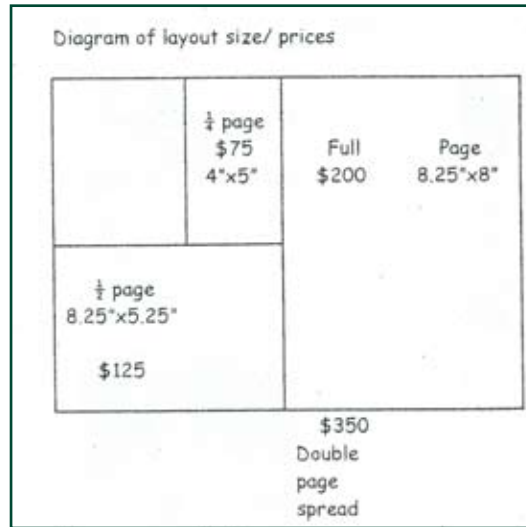
Yearbook Ad info and deadlines

HHS Supports Saigon Children's Charity

Hillsboro is still the largest single supporter of Saigon Children's Charity in the United States. As we head toward the Christmas season remember that Christmas Cards/ Tet Cards, the Vietnamese New Year (\$5.00 per pack) are available in Mr. Young's room, 107 or in the main office. If you would like to give the gift of education to a poor Vietnamese young person a scholarship is \$75.00 and provides for the child's uniform, books and supplies for the entire school year. The scholarship also provides the child's family or orphanage with 25 pounds of rice per month for the ten month school year.

Since Hillsboro first became involved with SCC in the 2003-04 school year we have sponsored over 600 children, built two schools and helped with the Thao Long Vocational School projects. The Director and employees of Saigon Children's

The Flex at Hillsboro

Hillsboro High School is closer to unveiling "The Flex," a multi-purpose coffee house/ performance/hang-out center for Hillsboro students, after a recent one-day cleanup blitz by volunteers from a Nashville church.

Nearly 20 volunteers from The Church at Hope Park-BCC descended on Hillsboro on Saturday, Nov. 1, with brooms, paint supplies, carpentry tools and a can-do attitude. Within five hours, the group had cleaned, primed and painted the walls of an old HHS auto shop garage; swept floors; installed shelves; and built a coffee bar and performance stage for the new Flex facility.

The volunteer effort was part of BCC's "Project One2One," a day-long event that sent nearly 500 volunteers out across Nashville to lend a hand to more than 30 community service agencies, non-profit organizations and Metro Nashville agencies needing assistance with various projects.

December Gateway test dates

The three state-required Gateway exams will be given in December for students who fall into one of these categories:

1. Students who took one of the exams previously but who has not yet passed the exam.
2. Students who took the class but didn't take the exam for some reason.
3. Students who took the subject at a private school and the private school didn't administer the Gateways.
4. Students who took the subject out of state and who now attend a Tennessee public high school.

Students who fall into one of these categories were sent a copy of the official practice book to help prepare them for the exam.

Test dates are:

December 2- Math Gateway

December 3- Language Arts Gateway and make up Math Gateway

December 4- Science Gateway and make up Math and Language Arts Gateway

December 5- Make up for all three Gateways

If your family is planning a move that will transfer your child to another school zone, please notify the Guidance Office. Call 298-8400, ext. 2046, at least 24 hours prior to withdrawal. This will allow us sufficient time to prepare transfer papers and to document current grades. Remember that all textbooks will need to be turned in before Hillsboro can release grades to another school.

Tennessee Authors Visit Hillsboro

Acclaimed Authors Susan Vaught and Suzanne Supplee discuss their new books, give advice to aspiring authors

Susan Vaught and Suzanne Supplee are in town for the famed Southern Books Festival, and they decided to visit Hillsboro to talk to students about their new novels. Both the novels, *Big Fat Manifesto* and *Artichoke's Heart* spoke to themes of body image.

Big Fat Manifesto is the story of Jamie Carcaterra, an overweight senior who uses her school's newspaper column to vent about what life is really like as a fat girl, and revealing all the stereotypes and prejudices that prevail in the media and public attitude in relation to being fat. The story chronicles her struggle to confront society's obsession with thinness, all while trying to win a scholarship to North Western and coping with her boyfriend's bariatric surgery.

The authors also discussed the writing process, and how they got their ideas for their novels. Vaught drew from her own life experiences to create Jamie, but she says she wishes as bold and as

strong as Jamie. Vaught started the book while she was working to meet the deadline of her newest upcoming novel, *Exposed*, because the voice of Jamie kept on cropping up in her head. She discussed how difficult it could sometimes be to be creative on command in order to meet deadlines, and how she ended up having to write *Big Fat Manifesto* in four weeks.

Artichoke's Heart is written in a similar vein; with the main character Rosemary Goode constantly fighting against the person she sees in the mirror.

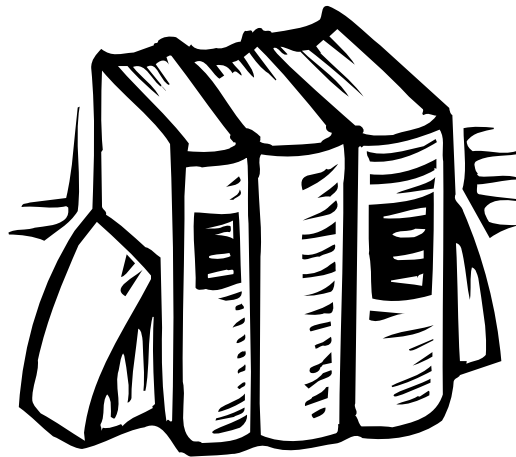
Supplee, while getting her hair done at a beauty salon, came up with the idea for her novel, wondering how it would feel to work at a beauty salon, constantly surrounded by mirrors. This is where she got the idea for Rosemary. Rosemary, a painfully shy person, deals with the vicious remarks from her peers and her mother's development of Hodgkin's disease. The metaphor of the artichoke is used as an image of Rosemary's transformation, both through her weight loss and journey to find herself.

The authors answered questions about their books, and helped with advice with writing. Both authors say that writing and reading helps establish the art of a great author.

Check it Out! The Hillsboro Library

This fall has been very busy at the Hillsboro Library. Hillsboro was fortunate to receive a very generous gift from Tennessee Humanities and the Southern Festival of Books. Over 100 students and teachers received new hardcover editions of *Artichoke's Heart* by Suzanne Supplee and *Big Fat Manifesto* by Susan Vaught. Students read the books and then were able to meet with the authors in conjunction with this year's annual Southern Festival of Books in Nashville. In addition, 25 copies of the National Book Award, *The True Story of a Part-Time Indian* by Sherman Alexie were given to students who had the opportunity to meet Mr. Alexie personally at a special lunch gathering at the Nashville Public Library. Authors and organizers continued to comment on how intellectually curious Hillsboro readers are. Hillsboro students volunteered all weekend at the Southern Festival of Books giving their energies to help set up the book festival, run errands and even come to life as the Cat in the Hat, the Berenstain Bears, and Franklin the Turtle. Next year we look forward to continuing this wonderful relationship with Humanities Tennessee and we thank them for supporting Hillsboro.

The library is working very hard to update our collection and significantly enhance our fiction and pleasure reading section. Research studies strongly support students interest in reading (magazines, books, newspapers, web sites) and their success in college. We are working to continue to keep students interested in



reading throughout high school. Also, we have been working with the English Dept. at Hillsboro in teaching all students how to be critical thinkers by thinking critically about how they find and use information. Students are doing a great job at not only using college-level databases to research all kinds of topics but they're very responsible in citing their resources and integrating their own thoughts with powerful papers, poems, power point presentations and posters.

The library is in the process of "weeding" out older books and resources. If you enjoy sorting through used books, please come and help us. We are also glad to get these "old friends" into the

hands of our young students. Please encourage your child to come browse for free. If you would like to honor a student or teacher, please consider purchasing a book for the library. This is a great way to make a lasting impression.

We will also appreciate your support on December 10 from 5-7 p.m. when we host the Hillsboro Library/Davis-Kidd book fair at the Davis-Kidd store. Hillsboro will receive 20% of everything sold (including food) in the store during that time frame. Join us and the Jazz Band, Orchestra, and Sophisticats as we get you into the Christmas spirit.
